

### Heart Filled Card



It's the end of the school year and many of you may want to give a little thank you to a special teacher, family member or friend. A simple handmade Thank You card is always appreciated and you can share with them on your virtual site or take a picture to email to that special person. It will be a surprise that's sure to brighten their day.



#### What you need:

- White glue and scissors
- 5 different colours of card stock (to be cut to 10 x 15cm (4x 6"))
- 8 1/2 x 11" copy paper or coloured paper
- Pencil and erasure
- Black marker



#### First steps

All 5 coloured sheets should be cut to 10 x 15cm (4x 6"). Fold all 5 sheets in half. Fig.1A. Draw half of the heart on the top sheet. Cut along the line. Fig. 1B. When you unfold all the sheets, you will have a heart that is even on both sides. See Fig. 2.



With all 5 sheets held in place, draw about 5-6 wavy lines across the heart. Fig. 2.

Keep the sheets together and cut along each wavy line. The first cut should be at the top of the heart along the first wavy line. Put this first cut down and keep it together. Do the same with each section you cut and place them down in separate stacks in the shape of a heart - top to bottom - but do not mix them together. Fig. 3.

Fold the 8 1/2 x 11" coloured / copy paper in half. Then choose a different colour from each of the cut pieces and place them in position on the front of the folded paper in the shape of a heart. Glue the cut pieces onto the folded paper leaving a slight space between each cut section. Fig. 4.

With your pencil draw a light curved line on your card. Then print or cursive write your message along the curved line. Only write a 2-3 word message on the line. Then, with a black marker or sharpie, trace over the letters and erase the curved pencil line. Fig. 5.

Some suggestions for your message could be *Thank You*, or *I'll Miss You* or *Thinking of You*.

I had a little empty space on the front of my card so I added some flying birds at bottom. See the very first photo on page 1.

Other ideas for you might be drawing a long wavy line connected to the heart. This will make it look like a heart balloon that got loose and is flying away.

Or you could draw a basket connected with straight lines to the heart to make it look like a hot air balloon floating in the sky. Use your imagination and have fun with it!
